Growing up, Aaron felt like nobody wanted him. A product of a divorced family, he rarely saw his Mom or his Dad, "Dad would find alwavs every excuse on why he could not be there," stated Aaron. "Even when he was physically there, his attention was somewhere

else." As a single parent, his mom worked three jobs to keep a roof over their heads. His older sister, Gabby, would frequently go out with friends. Aaron found himself alone at home with TV and video games to raise him.

Anger Turns to Rage

Aaron had few social skills. Desperate for attention, he acted out. "I wanted friends- someone to say they cared - so bad that I would do anything to get them to notice me," Aaron recounted. His antics only alienated him more as the other kids thought of him as "weird" and made fun of him.

Loneliness turned to anger as he

got older. Unchecked, his anger boiled out in fits of rage. "Anger would at least get me attention; attention meant someone being present in my life," said Aaron.

The problems grew worse over time. Both parents had been through multiple divorces. Amongst this lack of stability and structure, Aaron and Gabby grew increasingly disrespectful and rebellious. Aaron's anger spiraled out of control. In 2005, after exhausting all other resources,

The Torture of Stability

The first weeks at Show-Me for 15-yearold Aaron were "torture." He did not want

to be there. Used to chaos, he felt lost in this new structure and stability. His plan was to put a mask on, go through the motions, and hope to return home as soon as possible.

After a year, Aaron's mask began to crack. He would see his Mom on holiday visits, each time hearing that he could come home

"Anger would at least get me attention; attention meant someone being present in my life." - Aaron 'soon.' Finally, she admitted to him that she did not know when things would be stable enough to bring him home and it might not be until he graduated.

"That was the moment it all changed for me," stated Aaron. "It hurt so bad. I broke. I stopped just living to get out of here. I started to look at my houseparents, not as my babysitters, but parents."

Living with separate families on the same campus allowed Aaron and his sister, Gabby, to focus on their own struggles while still remaining close.

Slowly, Aaron realized the importance and purpose of family, rules, and structure. As his relationship grew with his houseparents. he learned to open up more. Lovingly and consistently guiding him through life

and responsibilities, he found comfort through their affirmation. His Show-Me family showed him how a kind, caring, and consistent father was the spiritual leader of the family.

He didn't have to wear a mask to be accepted. Now that he had a family he could confide in, his frustrations no longer turned into uncontrollable anger. With this new outlook, his grades and attitude improved.

"Before, I felt I was not worth much because I couldn't do anything: I was 15, had no skills, except playing video games," said Aaron. "Now, I had people who cared and wanted to invest in me...

for ME. They challenged and showed me how to be a man, teaching me discipline, hard work, and perseverance to finish. It was one of the best growing seasons of my life."

Finding Purpose in Serving

In 2007, Aaron and his sister returned to their mother's home. The siblings had more positive attitudes, and their Mom had made significant improvements, herself. However, "it quickly returned to being all about me and doing anything I desired," Aaron recalls. "I didn't have the discipline

or structure to develop the character I needed to succeed as an adult." The next two years he again felt empty and without purpose.

Feeling lost, he attended a youth conference that summer. There, he reconnected with God and his larger Christian family. "I was brought back to when I was a Show-Me kid – that closeness that I earnestly desired and whole-heartedly missed."

Aaron realized the more he focused on himself, the lonelier he felt. Serving others gave him purpose. His life would be about encouraging; ensuring that the lost and hurting know that they, too, are wanted and a beloved part of Christ's family.

She added, "Show-Me took Aaron as an angry boy, hitting walls, and back-talking, to a young man that is gentle, has compassion, is kind, and appreciative of what God has done in his life. Seeing Aaron's continuous growth has made me a very proud Mom and very thankful for a place called Show-Me Christian Youth Home."
